

# **Restoring Hope**

#### Natalia, Solicitor

When Theresa\* first came to us she was in a constant state of fight or flight. Dealing with deep trauma and a troubled past had left her vulnerable, scared and, most painful of all, unable to see her children for some time.

She was a mother longing for restoration with her children, and she was ready to do the hard work required to change her life and her future.

Our team listened to her, shared words of hope, and reminded her that she was worthy of healing and transformation.

We worked with Theresa to bring her case before the court and secured therapeutic intervention to give her family the tools to rebuild.

Theresa demonstrated incredible strength, persistence and resilience whilst confronting her past and the scars they had left behind.

She trusted us as her advocates and began to rebuild herself and find her purpose

Through her perseverance, she was able to reconnect with her children. She has since been working towards her goal of parenting them again, not as a mother weighed down by guilt and shame, but as one renewed with hope

After her case was resolved, she shared these words:

"By the time I got to you guys I was not in the right state of mind or had the right support. I felt no lawyer was there to advocate for me and my horrific past. I felt you both advocated for me so well. I've never really felt so seen and held in my life. You saved me emotionally and not just legally. Thank you to your organization for everything."

Her testimony reminds us why we do what we do. Advocacy is not only about legal outcomes, but about restoring dignity, hope and family bonds. For us, we trust that God uses our profession as a vessel for healing those broken, at the right time.

As Scripture reminds us, "He heals the broken hearted and binds up their wounds"

We are grateful for Theresa's trust and courage. Even in brokenness, there is always hope for new beginnings.

# **Tackling domestic violence** together

#### Todd, Solicitor

As a representative of Horizons, I was recently asked to deliver a keynote session at the Northern Beaches Domestic Violence Network's annual conference

It was an incredible honour as I spoke to 120 frontline workers from 30 plus services about Apprehended Domestic Violence Orders (ADVOs).

ADVOs sit at the intersection of safety, policing and family law, which means a lot of different services deal with them. It's also an ever-changing legal landscape, which makes ongoing training vital, especially for those from a non-legal background.

As a Horizons supporter, you know we provide practical legal help to families in crisis through our free phone advice line, church-hosted advice clinics and where appropriate, ongoing support and representation.

What you may not know is that we are also deeply connected with other frontline services and like-hearted organisations in mutual partnerships.

As a community legal service, we know we are one part of a bigger picture: a multi-service, multi-disciplinary network of services creating safety and hope for domestic violence survivors and their families.

That's why it is a privilege to be invited into networks like this to share our knowledge and expertise with other dedicated professionals.

It also speaks to the fact that Horizons is a known and trusted voice in the sector.

Our 20-year legacy of providing quality free legal advice, being a consistent community resource that anyone can access, and showing love and grace to families in crisis has proven our reliability. And we wouldn't have been able to do any of that without your dedicated financial support, prayers and encouragement.





# Thinking about Baptism?


