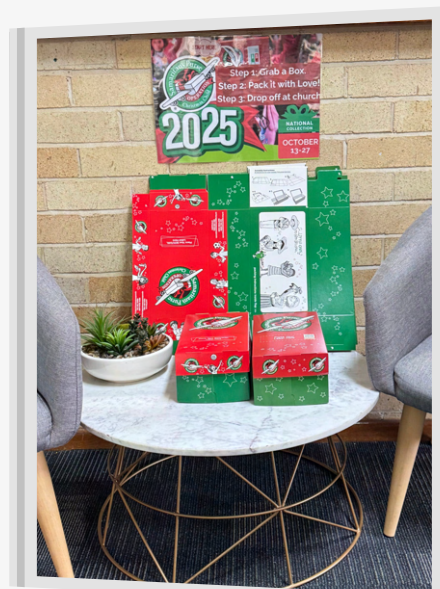
Operation Christmas Child

Growing pains put berries in spotlight

Strawberries, blueberries and raspberries are a firm favourite for Kitty Fewchuk's young family. The mother from Eastwood regularly serves either fresh and frozen berries, depending on the season, to her two older children Lucas, 5, and Hazel, 3, and intends to do the same for newborn Freya when she is older.

"We do a lot of milkshakes in the morning, and we always chuck some berries in it, just for the antioxidants and extra goodie, healthy components," Fewchuk says. She is concerned by recent headlines about high pesticide residues on blueberries and raspberries grown in northern NSW, as first reported by the ABC. She does not spend more for organic berries because she tends to trust authorities about food safety, but is keen for more information about what the pesticide residues mean for her family's health.

"Are they going to be concerned enough to go 'OK guys, you can only eat blueberries three times a week' or something like that?" Fewchuk says. "I've got children who are very susceptible to chemicals because they're very young in age, so I need to know what does that mean to my daily life?"

Australians are eating more berries than ever before. Nationally, berry production has risen from 77,844 tonnes in 2013 to 167,777 tonnes in 2024, according to the Australian Horticulture Statistics Handbook. In dollar terms, it's a rise from \$567 million

says the blueberry industry is barely regulated and current rules allow farmers to set up a massive blueberry operation next door to homes or organic producers and the community has no say. "It's outrageous that multimillion-dollar agribusinesses can plant intensive blueberry farms wherever they like, while neighbours are left to cop the spray drift and the water pollution," Faehrmann says.

She bought samples of raspberries and blueberries grown in the region and took them to her lab where she washed them in pure water, not just to remove the wax

consumers should be confident in the integrity of the system." Recent stories about pesticide residues were sparked by testing carried out by Professor Kirsten Benkendorf, a marine scientist at Southern Cross University.

Benkendorf was concerned about pesticide run-off in waterways, having found concerning levels of insecticides in oysters, prawns and mudcrabs in northern NSW estuaries.

The statement also found Benkendorf's methodology and analysis used were "not accredited for testing fresh fruit such as

pesticide use," Benkendorf says. "However, I also believe the community has a right to hear about any independent research, in order to make informed choices about the food they eat."

Even certified organic berries Benkendorf's tests had some level of contamination, but much lower than those conventionally grown. Benkendorf was also concerned by the levels of dimethoate in her results. This is a chemical banned in Australia, though banned in Europe and listed as potentially carcinogenic in the United States.

While the berries were within the legal residue limits for dimethoate, the levels on some were enough that an 80kg adult could exceed their acceptable daily intake by eating half a punnet and a 20kg child by eating a small handful.

Benkendorf says the bigger question is whether the maximum residue limits (MRLs) set by the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) are fit for purpose. The regulatory limits until recently were based on 1955 consumption data.

If berries had the maximum amount of pesticides on them, then safe daily consumption would be only two to four blueberries a day for a 20kg child and five to 16 blueberries for an 80kg adult, assuming the same pesticides are not also found in other food.

The pesticide authority recently proposed a suspension of dimethoate for use on blueberries, blackberries and raspberries. In a statement, APVMA says this was not triggered by recent media coverage or residue testing, but data showing a significant
